Since Check-Out Hunger began in 1994, the program has raised more than \$1.25 million for Hawaii's hungry. Kraft Foods came on board as the major sponsor of the program in 2003, and each year kick starts the program with a \$5,000 donation. This year's donation of \$184,940.03 is the largest amount raised in the existence of the program.

The Hawaii Foodbank, in partnership with the food industry and the community, serves as a link between charities and those in need of food assistance. Its drivers collect food from supermarkets, distributors and wholesalers and deliver it to the Foodbank warehouse for inspecting and sorting. Goods are then made available for distribution to 250 charitable agencies on Oahu to feed the hungry. It also distributes food to the Neighbor Islands through The Food Basket, Hawaii Island's Food Bank, the Maui Food Bank, and the Kauai Food Bank.
